

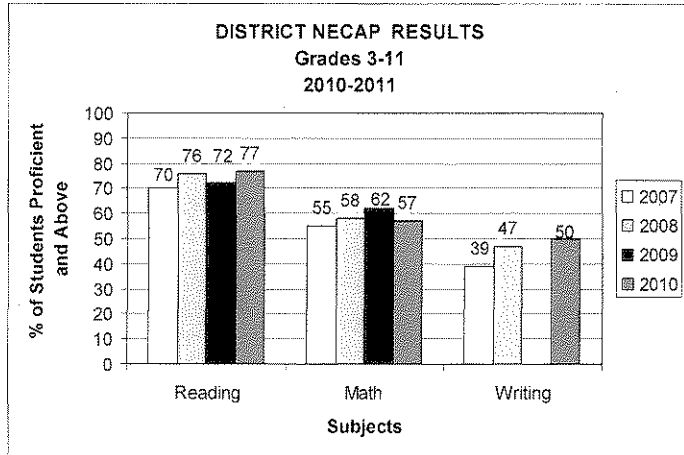
NEW ENGLAND COMMON ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (NECAP)

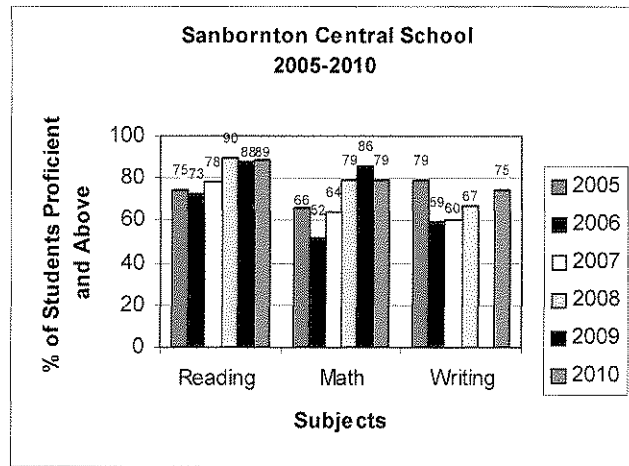
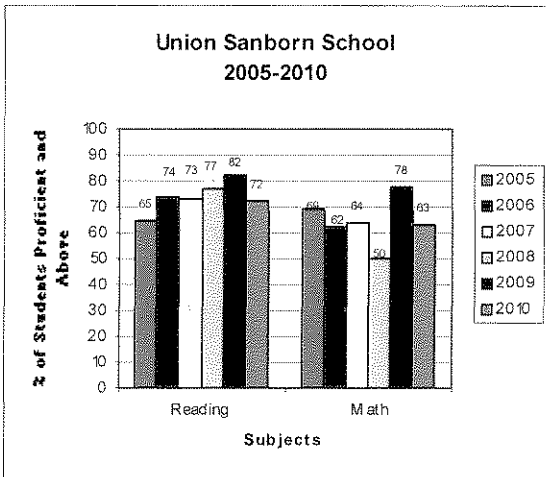
DISTRICT RESULTS:

On January 31, 2011, the New Hampshire Department of Education released the October 2010 New England Common Assessment Program (NECAP) testing results in Grades 3-8 and 11. The District results show that students in grades 3-8 and 11 met or exceeded proficiency achievement levels in reading at 77% in mathematics at 57% and in writing at 50%. The data chart to the right shows a 5% increase in reading proficiency a 5% decrease in mathematics and a 3% increase in writing.



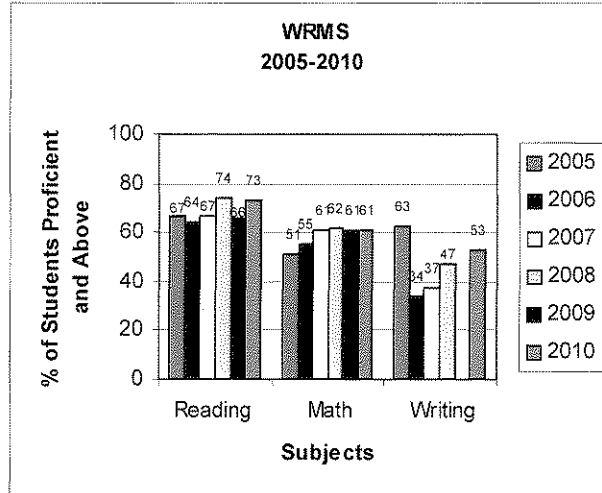
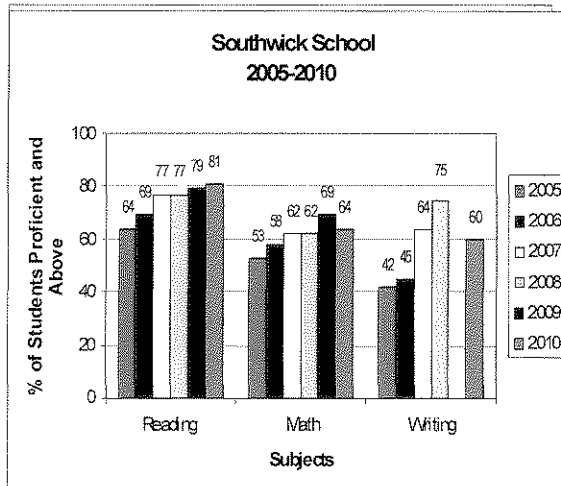
Union Sanborn decreased student achievement in reading by 10% and in math by 15%.

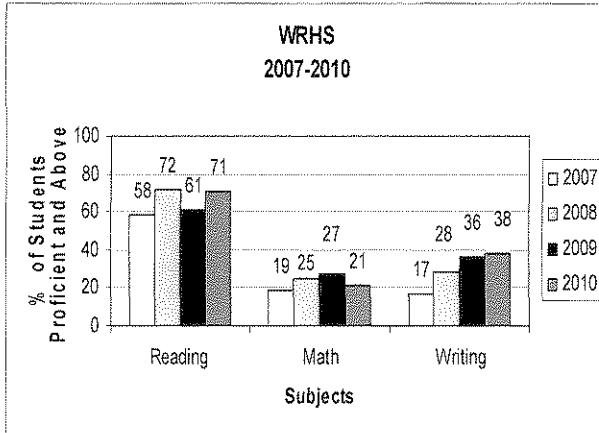
Sanbornton Central School increased student achievement in reading by 1%, writing by 8% and decreased in math by 7%.



Southwick School increased student achievement in reading by 2% and decreased in math by 5% and writing by 15%.

Winnisquam Regional Middle School increased student achievement in reading by 13% and writing by 6% while maintaining in math.





Winnisquam Regional High School increased student achievement in reading by 10% and in writing by 2% while decreasing in mathematics by 6%.

The District has shown some improvements in reading and writing, but decreased in math. Last year, the District increased student achievement in math. In our efforts to achieve sustained improvement, a curriculum audit has been implemented to assess strengths and weaknesses in curriculum, instruction, data monitoring, and interventions during the 2010—2011 school year. The final report will be presented to the Board in February 2011. A plan will be designed for improving and sustaining student learning achievement in the District.
