You are a chaperone, and the safety of all the kids is the first priority. So, enforce all school rules and don't tolerate any inappropriate behavior.

As a chaperone our expectation is for you to watch for inappropriate behavior, and assist us in ensuring that all students are acting appropriately and safely. An administrator and additional faculty members will be on site during the event if any situation occurs.

Model respectable behavior. You are expected to be a role model at all times. Remember, you are within a Safe School Zone (RSA:). This means you should not be under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances. These behaviors send contradictory messages to high school students.

Learn your responsibilities before you arrive at the dance. You may have a station or duty. It is important that you follow your given assignment so that the "faculty member in charge" can rely on adult supervision of all areas.

Learn acceptable and non-acceptable high school behaviors at a school dance from those in charge. Watch for non-acceptable behaviors and determine your response by conferring with the "faculty member in charge." For example, some schools prohibit kissing on the dance floor; others do not. No "grinding during a school dance" etc.

Remember: Tact and discretion serve to protect youth and adults alike. All infractions of improper conduct must be reported to the Administrative staff or the designated faculty member in charge. The Administrative staff or faculty member will determine the necessary course of action. This will provide fair and consistent treatment for all involved.

Chaperones at Winnisquam High School are expected to follow and enforce the following rules:

- 1. No obscene language.**
- 2. No vulgar dancing.**
- 3. No forms of Public Displays of Affection.**
- 4. One person per chair.**
- 5. All rules in the handbook will be enforced.**
